Program for Academic Exchange (PAX): This program offers incoming exchange students diverse courses taught in Chinese or English in the Colleges of Liberal Arts, Agriculture and Natural Resources, Engineering, Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, Veterinary Medicine, Management, Law and Politics, Life Sciences, and Science. Lab Exchange: This program offers incoming exchange students the opportunity to do research under the professors' instruction. We offer research related to many fields of study. Each student will be assigned a mentor professor for consultation during his/her stay at NCHU. We welcome students who are interested in learning more about Taiwan to join PAX/Lab Exchange and share their culture with us!
Eligibility	✓ Be currently enrolled as a full-time undergraduate or graduate student at an NCHU partner institution. ✓ Have successfully completed at least one year of study at home institution. ✓ Be nominated by the Office of International Affairs or equivalent office of the home institution according to exchange agreements.
Benefits	1. Tuition waiver (The fees of mandatory insurance and accommodation are not included. Students need to pay both fees by themselves.) 2. Monthly stipend will be offered upon budget availability and qualification of students. 3. We will offer Free Basic Chinese Course. Plan of study (written in Chinese or English) 6. Biography (300 to 500 words, written in Chinese or English) 7. Certificate of proficiency in Chinese/English (optional) 8. Supplementary materials (optional) 【Note】 Please scan your documents; We do not accept blurred documents.
Application Procedure	Step 1: Go through the nomination process of the home institution. Partner institution needs to fill out online nomination form before deadline. Step 2: Nominated students must upload all required documents to application website before deadline. Step 3: Application will be reviewed, and final decision will be made by the University Review Committee. Results will be announced by the end of June and mid-December for Fall and Spring semester, respectively. Step 4: Official admission package will be sent to program coordinator of partner institutions. Step 5: Admitted students need to confirm admission and provide arrival information online if admission is accepted.

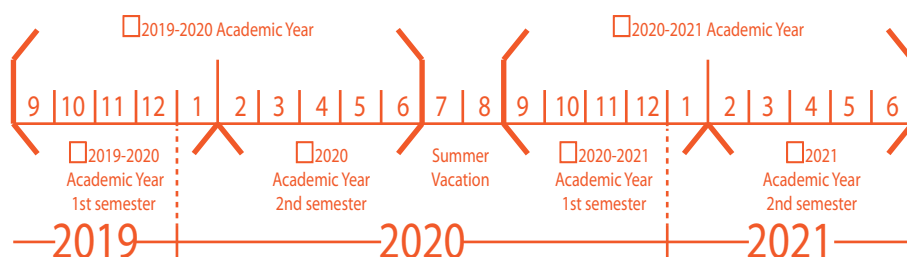

1. Reitaku International House and Sung-Tao Hall are located on Tamsui Campus.
2. TKU currently offers:
 - (1) Shared room for 3-4 persons at Reitaku International House.
 - (2) Shared room for 2 persons at Sung-Tao Hall.
3. The accommodation charge (meals not included) is NT\$11,000 plus NT\$2,000 for Residential Services Fee per semester. The total cost is NT\$13,000 (approximately US\$450).
4. The accommodation costs (Residential Services Fee not included) vary based on reciprocal basis made between sister universities and TKU.
5. Both Reitaku International House and Sung-Tao Hall are closed during summer and winter vacations.
6. Rooms are randomly assigned. And selected applicants will be notified by OICSA via e-mail.
7. TKU reserves the right to arrange the rooms.
8. TKU reserves the right to change dormitory assignments if no rooms are available at either Reitaku International House or Sung-Tao Hall.
9. Tankang dormitory :Dormitory fee is NT\$19,250 plus NT\$3,000 Management fee and NT\$3,000 Deposit.
